TO END THE OVERPOPULATION CRISIS

Baja California Sur, along with the majority of the world is facing a dog and cat overpopulation crisis.
Rescues and shelters are struggling to keep up with the constant surrendering of unwanted dogs and cats. The only way to get ahead of it is through extensive sterilization programs.



TO PROVIDE RELIEF FOR THE LOCAL COMMUNITY

The cost of a single sterilization is more than the average daily wage here in BCS. The majority of the local residents are doing their best to care for their beloved pets, however owning a pet here is a huge expense.



TO PREVENT SUFFERING

A female dog can give birth to up 24 puppies per year, and a female cat can birth up to 20 kittens per year. Animals born on the streets are condemned to a life of suffering. Dying of preventable diseases, infection, starvation, being attacked by another animal, or run over by a car.



ENVIROMENTAL CONSERVATION

Domestic cats are an invasive species. A cat has strong survival instincts and great hunting ability, however, they are also known to kill for sport. We often see native bird species decimated by cats. Additionally, the native bobcat population is at risk due to the rapid transmission of diseases originating from domestic cats.

TO PREVENT TERRITORIAL - BASED AGGRESSION

There has been an alarming increase in dog bites and dog attacks. With the increase in street dogs, it is not surprising to see more dogs acting aggressively towards humans as well as other dogs.

- Baja Pet Rescue's goal for 2025 is to perform 1000 sterilizations in La Ventana and surrounding communities.
- A single surgery costs about 630 pesos or \$31.50USD
- A 30 animal spay campaign costs about 19000 pesos or \$950USD
